



## The 27th Bad Etiquette Classic

Once upon a time when aeroplanes filled the skies, people hugged, workers commuted, Zoom was an ice-lolly and no one had heard of Wuhan or Matt Hancock, Mark, Pete & Julian met up to discuss dates for the 27th Bad Etiquette Classic. *Met up?* Yup, for a beer in the Lamb & Flag, Covent Garden in January 2020. *Are you serious?* Yes. They met to set the date for the 27th Bad Etiquette Classic with not a hand gel dispenser, face mask or pangolin in sight. *Insane. Imagine the risks.*

More remarkable still, they agreed 4 potential dates for the 27th BEC and left the pub pleased with their progress. But ... and perhaps you've read this somewhere previously ... 'It's not that simple' when it comes to the BEC. Later that same week the Founder Member for Henley emailed to say that he had inadvertently failed to fully factor in a family holiday to Cornwall, a business critical board meeting and a much needed trip to Boston. As such available options to put to the wider group were Sat 19th Sept, Sat 19th Sept, Sat 19th Sept or, at a stretch, Sat 19th Sept.

By the end of February the itinerary was confirmed. As part of the ongoing BEC Nostalgia Series we would be returning to Dorset and taking in the Isle of Purbeck (host venue for the inaugural Bad Etiquette Classic in 1994) as

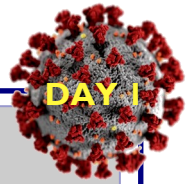


well as Crane Valley, Broadstone and Ferndown. With the virus now established on UK shores, it was clear from Ferndown's 'Practical Guide to Golfing during Covid-19' that BEC participants would need to be open-minded to change during the 27th BEC:

- Golf equipment should be washed before a player leaves home. *Quite right ... whether you're going golfing or not.*
- Golfers should travel to the club alone. *We've always found 8 cars to be the optimum number for 8 golfers.*
- Arrive at the course no more than 30 minutes prior to your booked tee time. *Two minutes is the BEC average.*
- Members and visitors may order from the bar but must not remain at the bar counter for more than 5 minutes. *After 5 minutes should we declare our drinks lost?*
- Do not touch a fellow golfer's equipment or balls. *We've known each other a long time, but none-the-less that is our general policy on Tour.*
- Golfers should stay 2 metres apart when walking to their balls. *Such is the variety of BEC shot-making, we rarely get within 50m of each other from tee to green.*



Seven month's later, amidst seismic disruption to the global sporting calendar, the 27th Bad Etiquette Classic went ahead as planned. Okay, so the Isle of Purbeck wasn't as good as we remembered it, we were missing BEC regular Richard Reeves for a second consecutive year, the specially commissioned BEC face masks were likened to 'budgie-smugglers' and were tighter than we might have liked them, and we couldn't celebrate epic golf shots with the usual high-fives, back-slaps, hugs, kisses and chest bumps, but Broadstone, Ferndown and the weather were majestic and the BEC came through the Great Pandemic of 2020 unscathed.



## Bad Etiquette Classic underway amidst Global Pandemic

Mark Powderham and Geoff Eaton took an early lead yesterday at the Isle of Purbeck Golf Club on the first day of the 27th Bad Etiquette Classic. In socially-distanced Match 1A, Geoff Eaton and Paul Smith battled to a 1 up win against Tea Pot holder Martin Lee and BEC legend Dave Grimbley whilst behind in hand-sanitised Match 1B, Mark Powderham & Julian Malton recovered from 1 down after 10 to record a 2&1 win against Pete Jacobs and David Law.

### Match 1A - Geoff & Paul vs Martin & Dave G

- Apart from the big reveal of Geoff's 'hinge' on the first tee, the front 9 is a low key affair
- Geoff's 4, 3, 5, 5, 5 finish including a net eagle and 2 net birdies secures a 1 up victory as Martin's 5 footer for par at the last fails to find the bottom of the cup

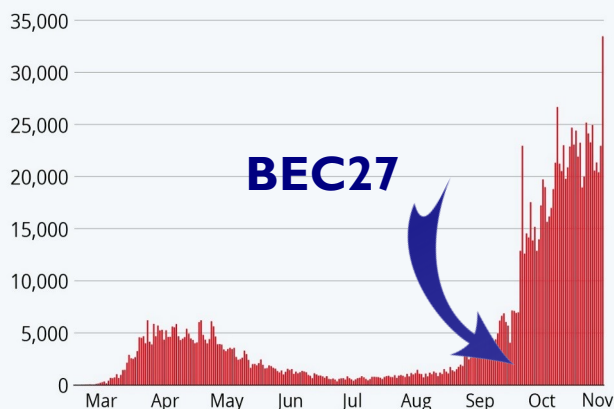
### Match 1B - Mark & Julian vs Pete & David L

- Mark pars the 359 yds 1st for the first NB recorded during a global pandemic
- Pete records not a single positive or negative extra all afternoon; his par 4 at the 324 yds 17th goes unrewarded due to his unprecedented 15 handicap
- Mark & Julian's 2&1 match win maintains Julian's 27 year unbeaten record at Purbeck (played 3, won 3)
- The course condition is a major disappointment; it's nothing like as good as we remembered it from the inaugural BEC in 1994

Mark leads overnight on £21 ahead of Geoff on £18 and Julian in 3rd place on £5

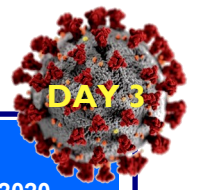

**BEC Leaders distance themselves around controversial Woodland Course**

Unperturbed by fellow competitors who described the Woodland course as 'nothing more than a farmer's field', Mark Powderham finished today what he'd started yesterday, recording 80 net 64 and a 5&4 match win with partner Dave Grimbley to regain the lead after three rounds of the 27th Bad Etiquette Classic.

**Match 2A - Peter & Geoff vs Paul & David L**

- In a BEC first, round 2 is played over 2 days and is (counter-intuitively) completed the day after round 3
- Paul and David lose 3&1 in a match reportedly without highlights ... but a leak from an unnamed source said David 'threw his golf clubs' when 3 putting for a net birdie at the 9th

**Match 2B - Mark & Dave G vs Julian & Martin**

- Mark notches up 3 nearest pins, two birdie 2's, 3 NB's and 2 NE's ... and his partner isn't complaining about the course either with 4 NB's on the front nine and a net eagle at the 10th

*Mark leads on £49 ahead of Geoff on £48 and Dave G in 3rd place with a handsome £0*

*Geoff calls home to inform the family that his earlier call that day to tell them that he was leading the BEC was perhaps a little premature and not entirely accurate*

**Records set and milestones achieved at the 27th BEC**

- First BEC played during a global pandemic
- Geoff records the BEC's 300th Net Eagle at Isle of Purbeck's 14th hole (377yds, par 4)
- First matches played over two days (matches 2A & 2B on the Crane Valley Woodland Course)
- The BEC's 100,000th shot is struck early on day 3 (back 9, Crane Valley Woodland course)



**Field blown apart at spectacular Broadstone**

Overnight leaders Mark Powderham and Geoff Eaton went head-to-head today in the 4th round of the Bad Etiquette Classic. Both players appeared to let their partners take the strain around the front nine, but from the 10th Powderham found form, returning in 42, while Eaton struggled, rallying only for par net birdie at the last after the match was lost 3&1.

**Match 4A - Mark & Paul vs Geoff & Julian**

- Julian is quickest out of the blocks with a longest drive at the first and net eagle at the 2nd
- Mark and Julian both hit superb irons at the 152yds 6th, Mark to 5ft and Julian to 7ft, but neither hole their birdie putts
- Paul levels the match with an impressive bogie 5 at the insane showpiece 7th (SI 1) and steals the front 9 with a (less impressive) 7 at the par 5 ninth
- Geoff & Julian fight back from 3 down after 11 to one down after 13, but they're 3 down again after 15 and this time there's no way back

**Match 4B - David L & Dave G vs Martin & Pete**

- Pete makes a gross sandy par at the 167 yds 11th and reports a past history of ticks in his groin area
- David L hits a low fizzing 3-wood followed by a low fizzing 5-wood into a nasty hollow at the 13th. From there he pitches to 3ft, holes for par NE and refrains from providing details of his past medical conditions
- Pete describes Martin's par 4, net birdie at the 18th as 'cynical' on account of their already having won the match at the 15th

*Mark leads on £73 ahead of Geoff on £28 and Pete in 3rd place with losses of £4*



## Powderham seals sixth Tour victory at immaculate Ferndown

With a £45 lead heading into the final round Mark Powderham was never likely to be caught during the final round of this year's Bad Etiquette Classic. And caught he was not, nullifying any chance of a comeback with a 5&3 match win over closest rival Geoff Eaton to secure a record sixth BEC Tour victory.

### Match 5A - Mark & Martin vs Geoff & Pete

- Geoff recommends a BECSHIT Pro's Tip of £100, but this is once again rejected by other Tour participants
- Mark & Pete are told to tuck their shirts in by the course starter in what years ago might have been classified as an 'Altercation with a third-party'
- Geoff enjoys 2 moments of brilliance with a birdie 3 NE at the 8th and a 30ft putt from off the green for birdie 2 NE at the 14th
- Pete cards a rarest-of-rare shortest drive, sandy par, net birdie (RRSDSPNB) at the par 5 13th
- 6 up after 11, Mark & Martin fall apart, but win 5&3. Mark finishes in style with two 10 yard tee-shots into the heather in front of the 18th tee



### Match 5B - Dave G & Julian vs Paul & David L

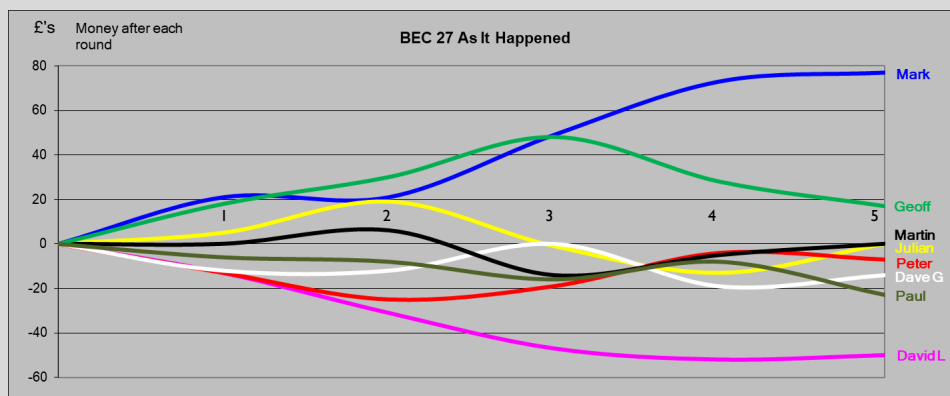
- Famous duo Dave G & Julian are looking to improve on their 'played 13, won 1' prior match-play record
- All square after 9 it's 'tighter than they'd like it', but from the 10th they unleash a golfing broadside with 6 NBs, an NP, LD and a sandy par to go 4 up
- They wobble briefly at the 14th with 2 blobs, but secure an emphatic 4&3 victory at the 15th
- Faced with a difficult lie under a tree, one player reportedly 'takes the knee', underlining the BEC's support for the 'Bad Flat Lies Matter' campaign



**Mark** - Five match wins out of 5 and a healthy collection of positive extras see Mark lift the Tea Pot for a record-breaking sixth time with earnings of £77. Congratulations Mark.

**Julian** - Following a solid start at the Isle of Purbeck, Julian loses ground and slips to 6th place, but he & Dave G record a rare match win at Ferndown to bring him home 3rd= with a class £0.

**Pete** - Off his new 15.2 handicap, Pete finds himself back in an uncharacteristic 7th place. A win at Broadstone restores him to 3rd, but at Ferndown he loses again finishing 5th with losses of £7.



**David L** - With 5 consecutive match losses, David resides in 8th place for the duration of the event until ultimately bailed out by MLI for only the 2nd time in his BEC career.

**Dave G** - Avoiding early heavy losses Dave briefly resides in 3rd place. But losses at Broadstone and Ferndown see him fall to 6th and narrowly miss out on an 8th Scarisbrick Tittle on countback to Paul.

**Martin** - The 2019 champion doesn't threaten in 2020 residing mid field following 3 match losses. But match wins at Broadstone and Ferndown assist him to a respectable 3rd= position on £0.

**Geoff** makes a strong start at the Isle of Purbeck and Crane Valley, but suffers heavy losses head-to-head with Mark at Broadstone. Congratulations Geoff on a well-earned £17 and 2nd place.

**Paul** - 2 early match wins position Paul mid field where he remains until the final round at Ferndown. There, he records his heaviest loss of the week (£14) but none-the-less wins the Scarisbrick Title.
