

And while we're at it, one other notable absentee, Richard R, unable to join us due to prior commitments made to his lucrative, alternative Saudibacked Tour.

Just as it was 5 years before, Hadley Wood GC was in fabulous condition with carpet-like fairways and immaculate greens. But beneath the beauty, a serious test of golf awaited us. When later the last putts had been holed, the beers poured and the scores checked, it became clear that the course had been more than
